Report on the Concord Market

US CONCORDS

The 2009 Concord crop harvested in the US totaled 396,790 tons, 50,340 tons or 11% less than in 08 and 7% less than the previous 10 year average. See chart 1. The crop size and conditions varied considerably between the 3 growing areas as described below.

NY/PA/OH - Parts of this area were hit hard by spring frosts resulting in many growers leaving vineyards unharvested. The tonnage harvested was 24% less than in 08. A cool, rainy growing season caused late and poor ripening with thousands of tons being harvested at below minimum brix. It also indicates buds developing to produce the 10 crop will be below average in fruitfulness. No serious fall frosts or winter damage occurred. Prospects for the size of the 2010 crop are slightly below average.

Michigan -The 09 crop was nearly equal in size to the 08 crop but yields per acre were below average in both years. The cool growing season included loses to spring and to fall frosts, a late harvest with excess rain and delayed maturity. No winter damage is reported. Prospects for the 2010 crop are below average.

Washington -The area produced a crop of about average size and of good quality. Serious fall frosts reduced the yields per acre for many vineyards and also reduced their crop potential for 2010 as leaves were killed before the fruiting wood had cured.

Prospects are for an average 2010 crop.

GRAPE PRICES

Industrial carryover inventory was very low approaching the 09 harvest. Eastern estimates of a reduced crop caused cash market processors to raise the prices an average of \$10.00/ton higher than in 08. The opposite occurred in the west as estimates of an increase in crop size caused cash market prices to drop \$20.00/ton. See chart 2.

CONCENTRATE PRICES

The opening prices increased in the east and declined in Washington. See chart 3. Prices have risen substantially since then and availability is practically non-existent with processors sold out until the new crop concentrate becomes available in November.

2010 CROP PROSPECTS

Vineyards in the 3 growing regions are entering spring with a variety of crop potential. Although it's a guess at this time of year, our impression is the 2010 crop will produce less tonnage than the past 10 year average which was 416,200 tons.

INTERNATIONAL CONCORDS

Brazil - The 2010 harvest which was completed during January - March was a huge disappointment due to excess rain, grapes rotting on the vine or falling to the ground and below average quality.

We don't expect any Concord or Concord type concentrates will be available for export and the supply could be short of their domestic market requirements.






The following charts highlight the '09 Concord crop and history of the industrial market.
