Report on the Concord Market

US CONCORDS

Harvest of the 2014 Concord grape crop in the US produced the second highest number of tons on record - 505,290 tons. (See chart no. 1 to compare). It followed the large crop harvested in 2013 of 451,590 and created a surplus and big drop in market prices for juice and concentrate.

Prior to 2013 the market was short of supply and prices of 68 brix concentrate reached the highest levels ever including a record of \$21.00/gallon. This caused many processors to reduce their requirements for Concord and substitute other cheaper grape juice concentrates which reduced the demand for Concord.

Processors who reduced their usage o f Concord concentrate due cheaper Red substituting vinifera grape juice concentrates are now finding Concord is the cheaper so could switch back to Concord and at the same time improve their grape flavors.

THERE ARE 3 MAJOR CONCORD PRODUCTION AREAS IN THE US:

NY/PA/OH had very little winter freeze or spring frost damage and had two good crops back to back in '13/'14.

<u>MI</u> had 2 above average tonnages in the same period.

<u>WA</u> which supplies over half the Concord products in the country had an above average crop in 2013 and a record size crop in 2014.

The large 2014 crop had little effect on reducing grower prices in NY/PA/OH because, by law, NY processors were required to publish their prices on August 15 before the huge crop size was realized. Later, in WA, the grower price fell to \$110/ton down from \$220/ton the previous year. Most of the crop ripened ok. It created a huge drop in the price of 68 brix Concord concentrate and prices are the lowest since 10 years ago.

Quantity of the fruiting wood for the 2015 crop appears to be average.

USDA is helping to relieve the surplus through its Food Assistance programs soliciting processors for substantial quantities of Concord juice since harvest.

Studying our charts on page 4 show a fantastic display of the power of supply and demand on prices. About \$20.00/gallon for 68 brix Concord a couple of years ago and currently as low as about \$8.00-9.00/gallon.

DID YOU KNOW?


Subzero tempertures as low as -26 Farenheit occurred February 15 in the NY/PA/OH and Michigan areas. Assesments of fruiting bud or trunk damage in Concord & Vinifera vineyards & fruits such as Peach will be ongoing.

Brazil is the only other worldwide Concord producing area. They have been a threat to US Concord pricing in the past. Their pricing to growers and the price of Concord concentrate have escalated while the US has decreased so they are now non-competitive in the US / Canada.




The following charts highlight the '14 Concord crop and history of the industrial market.
